

Statement on Regulation (EU) No 2019/1021 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 20 June 2019 on persistent organic pollutants (POPs Regulation)

Persistent organic pollutants (POPs) are organic substances that persist in the environment, accumulate in living organisms, and pose a risk to our health and the environment. They can be transported by air, water, or migratory species across international borders, reaching regions where they have never been produced or used.

The Stockholm Convention Persistent Organic Pollutants Review Committee (POPRC) reviews and updates the Stockholm Convention's list of persistent organic pollutants (POPs) which details the substances that are eliminated, restricted, or subject to limitations. Prosoft Technology monitors this list in conjunction with the requirements of Regulation (EU) 2019/1021 on persistent organic pollutants and The Persistent Organic Pollutants Regulations 2007.

Based on information provided by its suppliers, Prosoft Technology declares that substances, processes, and materials used or produced during the manufacture of its products at its US facility:

- Do not intentionally contain POPs;
- Do not involve laboratory-scale research using POPs;
- Do not use equipment containing POPs;
- Do not exceed the limits defined for unintentional trace contaminants of POPs.
